Click on the tab that represents the job(s) you are signing up for and time slots. Click on the Volunteer tab. You'll be prompted to enter your email address and name. It looks something like this.

Don't fear getting spammed, we pay for this service so there is no need for the host site to spam you. You may see that some jobs are already filled in. After you have done so, your name should appear as well. An email address is REQUIRED. The names are fairly free form so it's tempting to put your call in there or just your first name. Don't, that just messes it up when I export the names so I can print out worker badges for the Swap Meet.

If you don't do email or are otherwise reluctant to use the site, I will have to you up myself using my email address. You just won't get any notifications when the schedules are sent out before the Swap Meet. You will receive a confirmation email. KEEP IT! You'll need it if you want to change or cancel your signup. If you lose it, I'll have to change you manually. You can always make NEW signups by going to the starting URL. You can always send me questions at n7wa@arrl.net.

If you are new to the Club or the Swap Meet, don't be afraid to read that primer. It has descriptions of the event and each job. We have jobs for EVERYONE. And please don't just signup for two hours and say that's it. We have many jobs and many slots to fill. Don't be afraid to try different jobs. Of course, give yourself a break to find that special goodie you are looking for but after you have walked both floors three times, you'll be looking for something else to do.

Also, don't forget to sign up for setup and teardown if you can be there.

# Swap Meet Status

You'll find instructions on the previous page to sign up online as a worker for the Swap Meet. Signups open up November 15<sup>th</sup>.

In the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of October, we sent out signups to all our exhibitors from 2020. They have been coming back and people sound excited about the idea of a 2022 Mike & Key Swap Meet.

Shortly after we printed up the mailers, it was announced, by the State, that all indoor events with more than 1,000 attendees will have to check for proof of vaccination or a negative COVID test starting November 15<sup>th</sup>. We have to fully expect this will still be in effect in March, so we are putting stickers on the mailers warning folks of the possibility. If you are choosing to remain unvaccinated and want to work or attend, you should probably schedule a COVID test just prior to March 11<sup>th</sup>. Frankly, I am not sure of the effect that will have on our ticket takers. We may have to expand that group.

Since we are not having an in-person November meeting, I have lined up some volunteers to label the mailers we will send out in January. My thanks to those who volunteered. I had way more volunteers than I needed. That's nice. The ARRL kind of threw a wrinkle in the address labels for the mailers. I've been getting labels for 30 years and they have always arrived sorted by zip code. This year, they appear to be totally random. I picked up the first page of ten labels and it had 10 different zip codes. We will have to do a sort after labeling. Fortunately, we only have to sort by the first three numbers and we only have seven possibilities, 980 through 986.

The next Swap Meet meeting will be December 14th at 7PM. This is a Zoom meeting. Just use the published credentials for the Daily Ragchew. All are welcome. It's a good way to learn the organizational details of the event.

# Its Easier than Ever to Make a PCB

Back in the old days when we had to walk 20 miles uphill both ways in a snowstorm during a flood, making printed circuit boards (PCBs) was no easy job. After getting the circuit wired up, tested, and refined, we then had to sit down, measure all the component dimensions and begin to lay out the PCB pattern on paper. Next we prepared the copper clad board and used special tapes, pens, or photographic means to transfer the layout. Then came filling a glass baking dish with chemicals and etching away all the un-need copper. At the end, hoping we didn't forget a run or two, we had our ready to go through hole PCB. Of course, homebrew was limited to double-sided boards and today a commercial board might have up to seven layers sandwiched together.

Today this process is a lot easier; kids don't now how easy they have it (LOL). There are a lot of schematic design programs available online for free to help create the circuit and even simulated it. After this you can go to sites like <u>easyeda.com</u> (not an endorsement) to upload your schematic and have it converted to a PCB that's production ready. Some of these programs will automatically do the layout and others are more semi-automated. For your next project do a little research, find a app that works for you, and send an article to the Relay about your experience.
