For several years, Greg was a valuable and reliable emergency communications volunteer for our Kent Communications Support Team (later the Communications Support Team for Puget Sound Fire).

He loved electronics and especially working with vintage radio equipment. We had lots of fun times on Field Days and during our team drills. Before he retired, he worked in cell phone repair in Kent.

In his later years, he struggled with many heart problems and eventually he reached the point where there wasn't anything else medical science could do for him.

He will be missed by family and friends, particularly fellow hams.

March was another strong month for Solar Cycle 25. According to NOAA, the average sunspot number was among the highest of the past 10 years:



Originally, forecasters thought Solar Cycle 25 would be about the same as Solar Cycle 24, one of the weakest solar cycles in a century. March's sunspot numbers are the latest sign that Solar Cycle 25 will exceed predictions. In fact, Solar Cycle 25 has outperformed the official forecast for more than 24 months in a row.

7th District QSO Party

The 7th District QSO Party (7QP) is now the second largest QSO party in the country based on logs received. The 7QP encompasses all the counties of the FCC 7th District. That's pretty much the western part of the continental USA except for California.

In this test, the entire 7th District is the target of the rest of the country and a good chunk of the world. Those outside the district are looking for Hams AND Counties (all 259 of them) in the 7th district. Some of these counties don't even have Hams living in them so many participants make the effort to travel and operate from them. However, you can still have fun working from counties with larger Ham populations.

If you enjoy RVing, this is an excellent chance to combine two of your hobbies by going camping in a rare county. Others will run mobile through a number of states and counties throughout the 18-hour period of the contest. If you like POTA or SOTA, you can combine the activities. With 10m and 15m opening up, this can be a world-wide activity this year. Phone, CW, RTTY, and PSK are allowed. (Sorry no FT8 because it doesn't support the 5-character county ID's.)


Activity is enhanced by the New England QP, the Delaware QP, and the Indiana QP running the same weekend. The New England QP is similar to the 7QP by being a regional test for a group of states. EZNEC Update

For many years, EZNEC, by Roy Lewallen, was the antenna modeling program of choice. I know I had a license for decades. Roy retired a few years ago and made the program available for free. There have been a couple of bug updates if you are a user. I expect you would have to be a POWER user to be concerned though.

1) The Far Field table (via the "FF Tab" button) did not include columns for relative phase. In v. 7.0.1 the Far Field table typically had Deg/V dB/H dB/Tot dB columns. With v. 7.0.2 it now has Deg/V dB/H dB/Tot dB/V Pha/H Pha columns.

If you explicitly do ***not*** want to include phase in the table, use Special Options FFPhase = Off in the .INI file.


2) When using ***either*** the builtin NEC-4.2 engine (NEC-4D, available only with Pro/4+) ***or*** an external NEC-4.2 engine (Pro/2+ or Pro/4+), switching between Real/High Accuracy and Real/Extended Accuracy ground would not automatically signal that the engine must be run again to update various calculated data items. This was only a problem when toggling between those two ground choices. Switching to any other type of ground (Free Space, Perfect, or Real/MININEC) ***would*** signal that an engine rerun is required. Now fixed.

It is not necessary to uninstall v. 7.0.1 beforehand; v. 7.0.2 will overwrite it.


Workshop - 10,000-foot view of the SFI, A, and K Indexes




So, where is the meeting in April?
