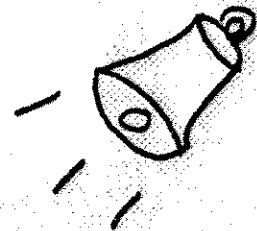

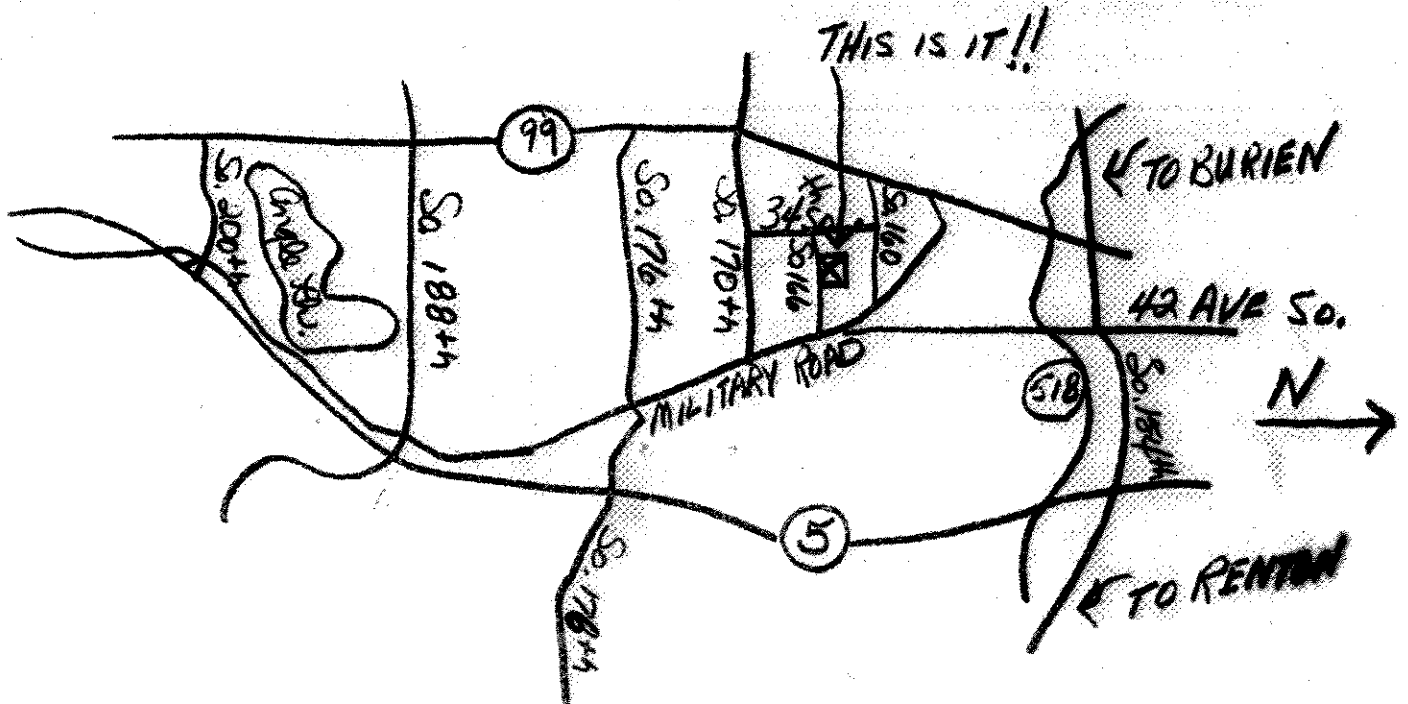

NOTES AND QUOTES FOR WOMEN (Men, please pass this on to your wives)

For those of you who enjoy baking during the Holidays and for those of you who do it out of necessity and are always looking for a new and different cookie recipe, HERE IT IS. They do not keep as long as other cookies do, but are different and good. AND WHAT'S MORE EASY TO MAKE.

FORGOTTEN COOKIES - Yield 30 cookies

- 2 egg whites at room temperature
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1 cup (6 oz.) chocolate chips
- 1 cup chopped pecans

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease cookie sheet very well. Beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Gradually add sugar, 2 teaspoons at a time, beat until stiff peaks form. Fold in chips and nuts. Spoon by heaping teaspoon out cookie mounds. Mound the cookies, maintain the shape you give them. Turn off oven and leave in oven until it cools, approx. 1 1/2 to 2 hours. To store use a container with a tight fitting lid, they keep fresh only 3 to 4 days.
