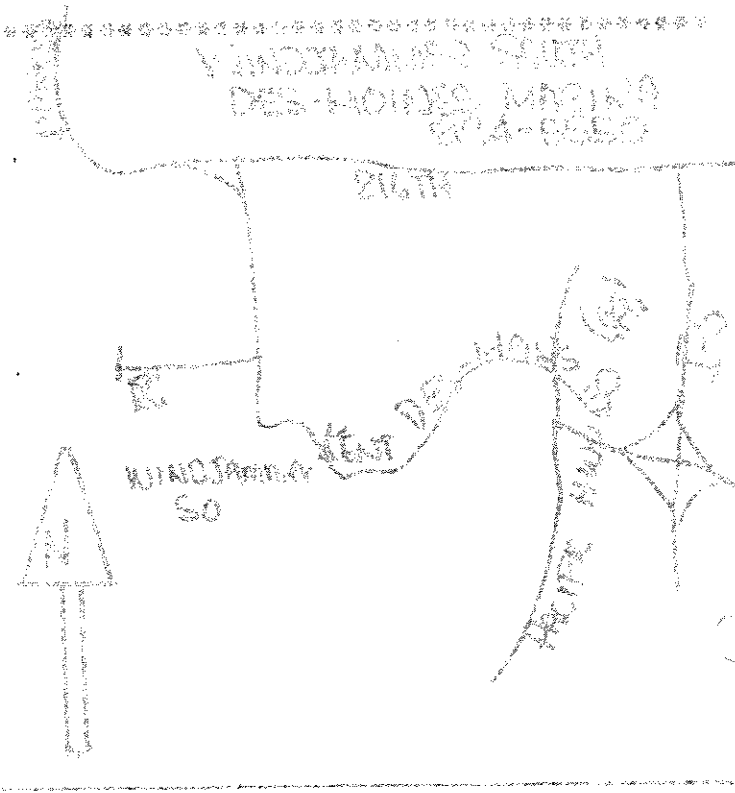
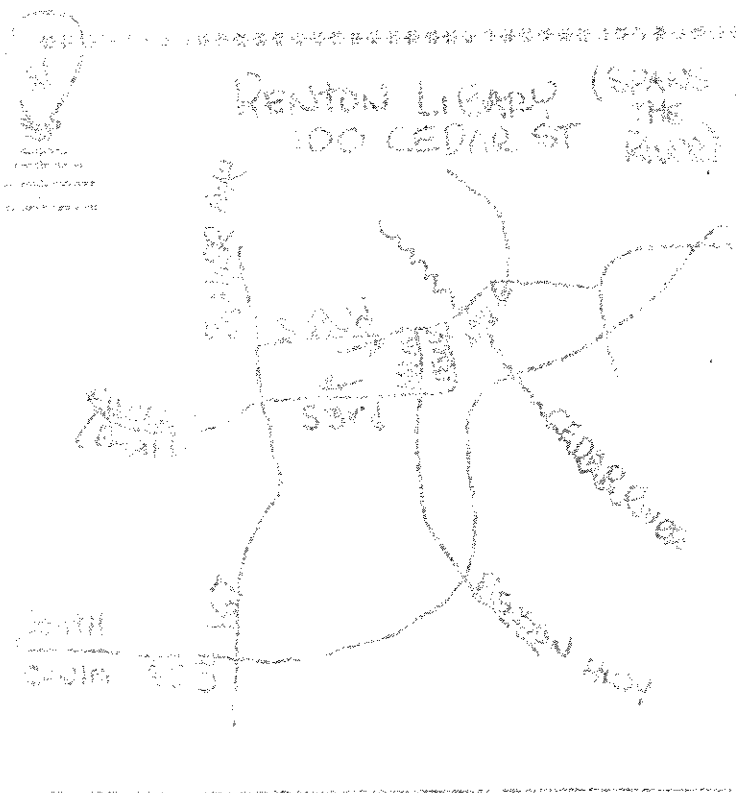
The fishing boat club has a good practice net nightly except Friday and

FIELD DAY RULES FOR 1976

After a long talk with the ranger at Fort Flagler, I have come up with a few rules that will have to be adhered to, to keep the State as well as our club happy.

1. No more vehicles than absolutely necessary may camp at the field Day site. The ranger will allow some camping on the site, providing we don't bend the rules anymore than we have to! At night each station is allowed one operating vehicle/unit and one support vehicle, period! All other vehicles/units used for sleeping and eating will spend nights in the group camp set aside for our group. The Field Day Chairperson and/or assistant shall make final determinations on this matter. Our Co-operation with the State in this matter determines future availability of this site. The camping fee is \$2.50 per unit, per night. This fee is payable in advance to Kathy WA7WMD, to save the problem of collecting late at night as happened last year.
2. The Field Day site must be left as we find it. This means pick up all garbage... Cigarette butts, paper, cans, bottles, nuts and bolts, ect.. The park ranger was pleased last year with our clean up crew... Lets keep him that way....
3. Try to keep noise down as much as possible. (and still have a good time) at the operating stations. Noise is distracting to some of our operators.
4. Murphy says accidents will happen when least expected, and the gun batteries are not safe for careless children or adults. Since we are operating on and around these large concrete holes this year, please be careful. Do not wander around at night without adequate lighting, and anyone bringing their children to the site will want to watch them very closely. Do not rely on others being around to do this for you. There are many places a person can fall and be seriously hurt. We don't want anyone to be hurt.

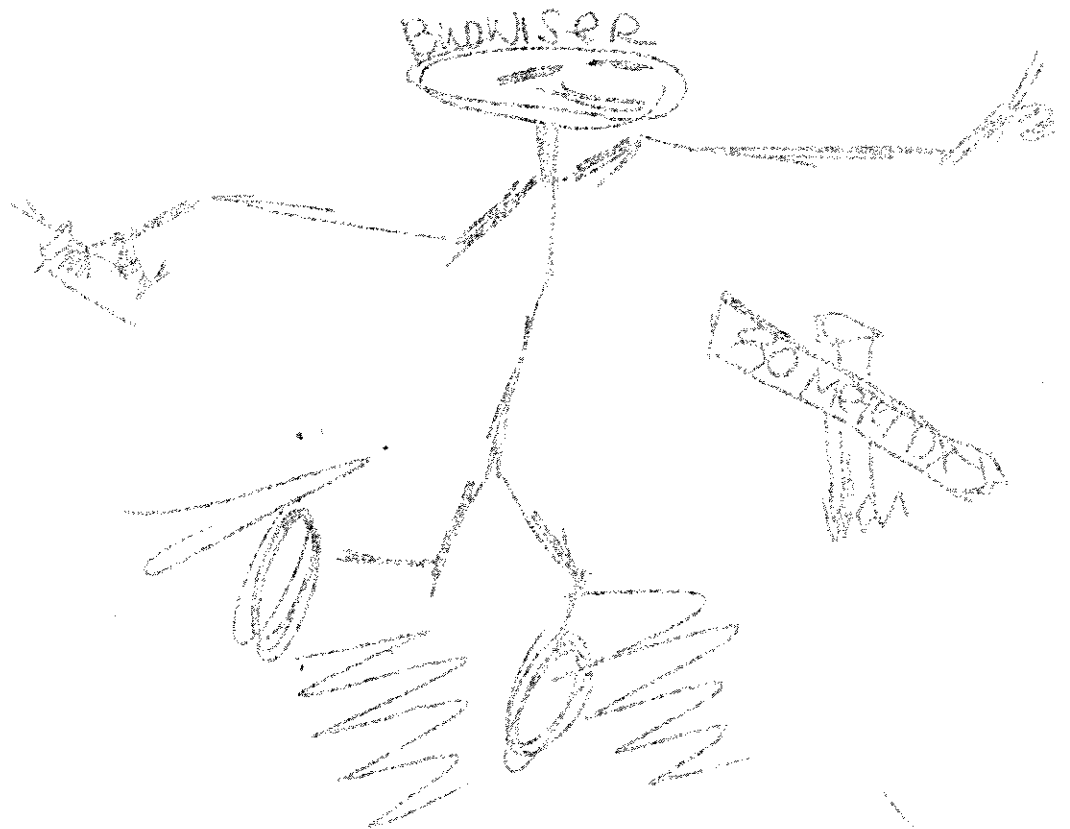
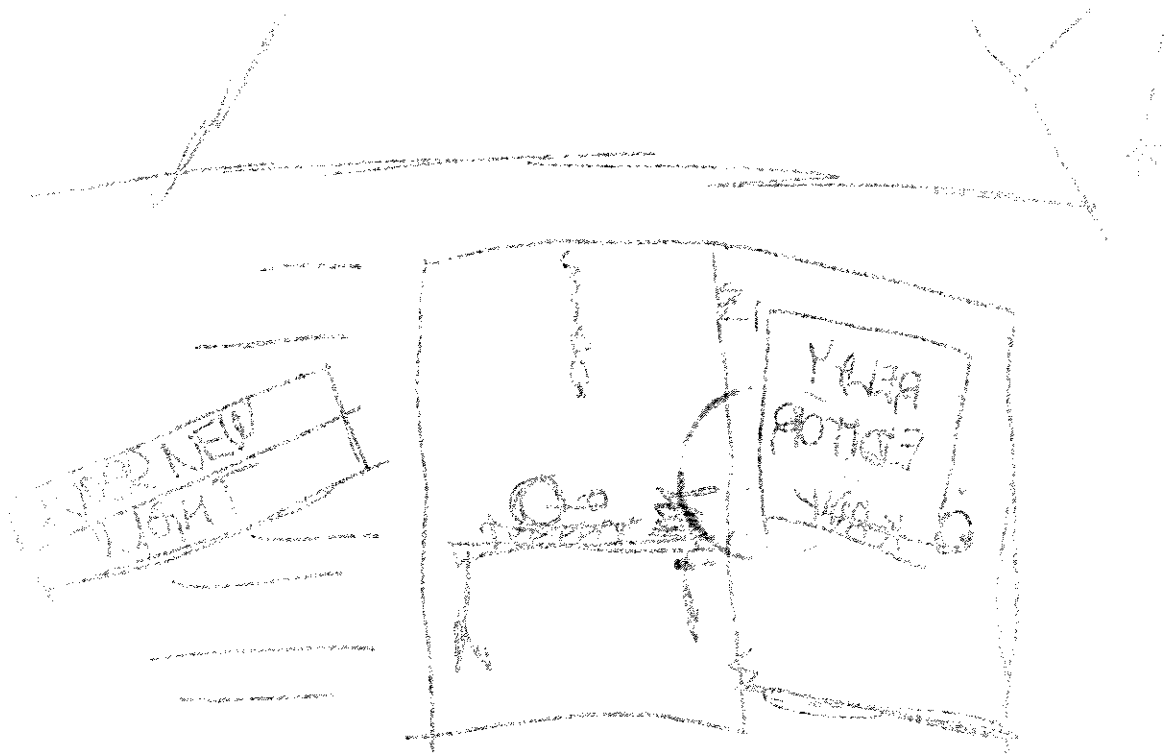
