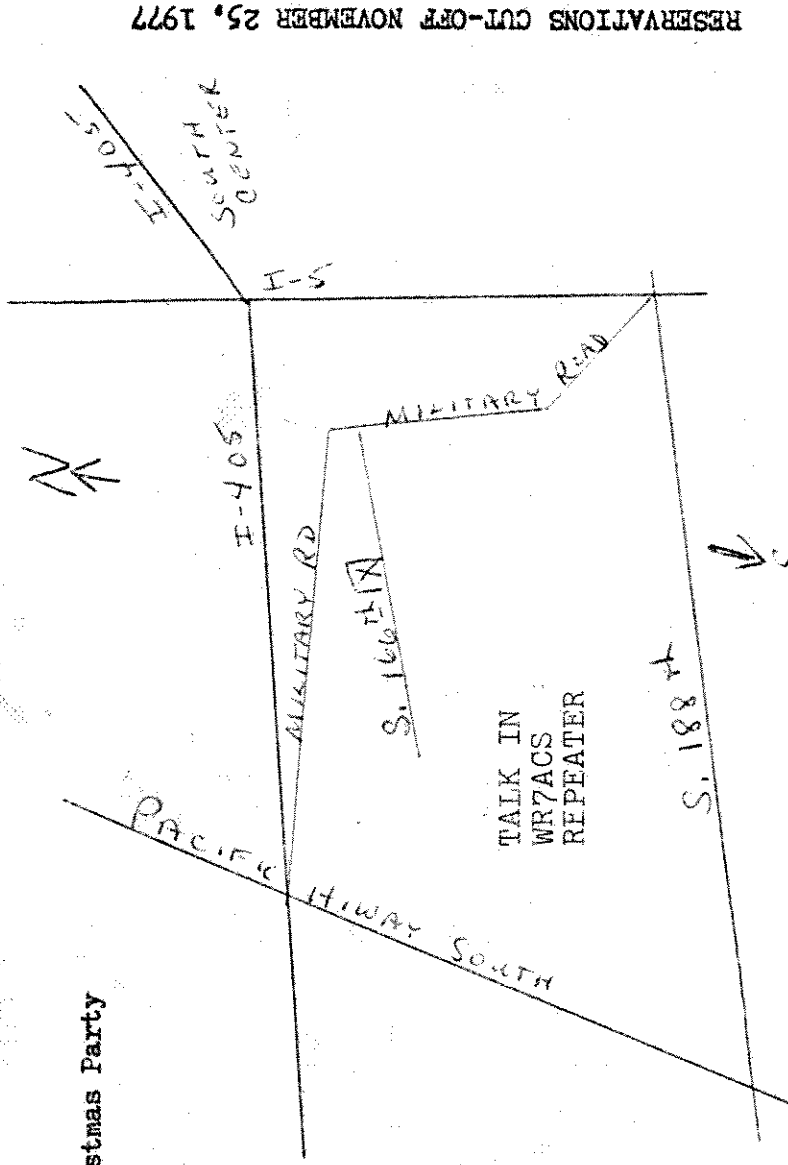
POT POURI
