THE PRES SEZ:

It would be nice to publicly identify these mysterious members of the clique, but I have a little test here to help you make up your own mind and see if you qualify for membership in the clique. Score one for each "yes" and zero for each "no".

1. Is your face usually seen at all club meetings, banquets, parties, and other activities?

Now for the scoring: Naturally, you know your total, but here is how it shapes up -- 8-10: You are part of the clique. 6-7: A borderline case, but working on it. 4-5: I guess you recognize the problem. 2-3: So what else is new? 0-1: Don't complain out loud -- someone may hear you.

Now for the solution: Elections for the club will be held at the April meeting. Nominations and volunteers for officers will be in order at the March meeting. If this club is a clique and you want to change things, now is your chance. See you at the next meeting.

EDITOR'S VIEWPOINT

Being a relatively new member (1 year) of the M&K club, and more recently as the RELAY editor, I have refrained from editorializing. However, this month nothing in the way of news has been submitted, so I am going to use the space to sound off.

When you join an organization, what do you expect from the group and, just as important, what are you going to give in return? Did you join our club because you don't have anything better to do on one Saturday morning each month? I for one could put my Saturday mornings to other activities. What are my reasons for joining? They can be broken into three broad areas: Social, interchange of technical information with increased technical and operating competence, and community service. Two of these (social and community service) are being reasonably satisfied by the M&K club. The other area (technical and operating) is not.

The Constitution and By-Laws are included with this issue of the RELAY. Article II of the Constitution states the purpose of the Mike and Key Club to be:

- A. Exchange technical information.
- B. Expand cooperation between members and interested nonmembers.
- C. Promote general radio and electronic knowledge.
- D. Expand amateur radio operating abilities and efficiency of individuals.
- E. Promote the hobby to the general public and community.
- F. Concentrate the Club's general activity toward public service amateur radio communications.

Four of these stated purposes deal with technical interchange and operation. What can the club do to better meet the requirements of our constitution? I should like to suggest the following possibilities:

1. Have a set program with a speaker at each meeting. Use this as a drawing card to entice members to the meetings. Remember, attendance requirements for continued membership failed. Time for this program could be made by shortening the business portion of the meeting. The normal business of the club should be handled by our elected officers. Compare this suggestion to the local, state and federal governments. We elect persons to handle the day-to-day affairs.

2. Encourage the exchange and dissemination of information through the RELAY. As it is presently being used, there is very little information exchanged. I encourage all members to submit information to be published. As editor, I welcome input as the paper can only be as good as what is submitted for publication. However, the deadline is the 25th of the month, and later material may or may not be published that month. I welcome all information, new gear, operating achievements, technical hints, items of interest to the ladies, letters to the editor, etc.

3. Prepare a program for presentation at a club meeting.

4. Be active in committees formed by the club to promote club interest to meet the purpose as stated in the Constitution.

Remember, our club can only be as good as the effort put forth by individual members working collectively towards the club goals.

GLEANED FROM HAM RADIO REPORT

CB EXPANSION ABOVE the present 27405 kHz channel 40 appears a distinct possibility for later this year. CB Magazine's Petition for Rule Making, RM-3299, proposed the addition of 40 new SSB-only CB channels between 27545 and 27995 kHz with an 11-channel alternative at the high end if the 40-channel proposal were to be rejected because of fears of problems from 455 kHz intermodulation. In addition, the Washington State CB Radio Association has also petitioned (RM-3317) for a new no-code Amateur service in that same frequency range (HRR 239, 240).

It Appears That Both proposals are being taken seriously by the FCC, which has funded an independent study of intermodulation and the relative performance of AM and SSB. CB Magazine's proposal in particular seems to have fallen on receptive ears, and both have now had their Comment due dates considerably extended.

Comments On Both RM-3299 and RM-3317 are now due by May 15, with copies to CB Magazine and the Washington State CB Radio Association respectively.

ARRL NORTHWESTERN DIVISION members have petitioned League Headquarters for release of ballots for the division director election, postponed by director's action in September pending resolution of W7QGP's suit (HRR 225). They've also petitioned to have Vice Director K7BT appointed interim director until the election is held.

ARRL Annual Dues Jumped to \$18, a 50% increase, effective April 1. Need for an increase had become increasingly obvious with the League's on-going heavy investment in WARC preparations, the Amateur satellite program, and Novice training compounded by the soaring "cost of doing business." With the increase, Life membership — pegged at 25 times the annual dues — goes from \$300 to \$450. Until April 1, of course, members have the opportunity to renew, extend (up to five years), or upgrade to Life at the present rates.

AMATEUR TRANSMISSIONS of emergency information cannot be rebroadcast by commercial broadcast stations, the Commissioners decided Wednesday. Acting on a petition (RM-2830) filed by the National Association of Broadcasters, the Commissioners agreed to further consider whether CB emergency transmissions should be rebroadcast for public use.

WHEN CHANGING CALL AREAS Amateurs other than Extras may well receive a "lower class" callsign if they elect to make a callsign change by checking Box 13A on Form 610. Their new callsign will be the current equivalent to the old call — a 2x3 for a 2x3, or 1x3 for a 1x3 — provided the Amateur is qualified for that type call under the current rules. The problem is, for example, with an Advanced class holder of a WAX3 or WBX3 who'll be issued a "current" 2x3 — a KAX3, which generally indicates a Novice! At the same time, the license is automatically renewed for five years, and the only time an Advanced class licensee can apply for a new call from the 2x2 "Advanced class block" is 60 days prior to license expiration.

ARTICLE VIII. Meetings Continued:

motion at least one month in advance of the changed date. Following the changed date, the regular meeting reverts to the third Saturday.

Section 2. The regular April meeting of the general membership will be the annual election of officers and trustees for the following year.

Section 3. Special meetings for special purposes may be called by the Executive Board at such times as are advisable. Such special meetings may transact only such business as is specified in the call, and special meetings may not supersede regular meetings except when specifically provided for.

ARTICLE IX. Amendments:

Any proposed amendment to this Constitution may be submitted in writing at a regular meeting of the Club. Such proposed amendment must be signed by three active members of the organization before being submitted to the membership. A mailed notice to active members must be made following that meeting. After such notice, an amendment may be voted on at the next general meeting and shall become a part of the Constitution only if approved by majority of active members.

ARTICLE X. Parliamentary Authority:

Roberts Rules of Order, Revised, shall be the parliamentary authority of this Club.

BY-LAWS

Section I - MEMBERSHIP

A. ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP - Official Club membership applications may be submitted at a regular business meeting by the individual requesting membership. Attendance at three out of four consecutive regular business meetings by the applicant will be required before the application can be submitted to the membership committee. The application will be submitted at the next general membership meeting providing the applicant is present. Two-thirds (2/3) of the voting members present must approve the application before the applicant can be considered elected to the membership. The application shall remain active for a period of three months from date of applicant voting eligibility.

B. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP - Associate memberships are available to those active members who cannot actively participate in Club activities. Applications shall be made to the membership committee for approval. Special consideration shall be given to those who cannot meet the above requirements.

C. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE - The membership committee shall consist of the Executive Board.

Section II - CONTINUATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Active membership in this Club is maintained by the following:

Section III - TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Membership in this Club shall be terminated by one of the following methods:

- A. Non-payment of dues within three months of due date. Or,
- B. Written request to terminate membership with non-refundable dues. Or,
- C. Unanimous recommendation of the full membership committee and the elected officers of the Club for violation of the Amateur's Code as presented by the A.R.R.L. Members considered for termination have the right of appeal before the general membership. Terminated members will be notified in writing.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I. Name:

This Club shall be known as the MIKE AND KEY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB OF WASHINGTON.

ARTICLE II. Purpose:

The purpose of this Club shall be to bring together those who are interested in the hobby of Amateur Radio. For this purpose, we shall attempt to accomplish the following:

- A. Exchange technical information.
- B. Expand cooperation between members and interested non-members.
- C. Promote general radio and electronic knowledge.
- D. Expand amateur radio operating abilities and efficiency of individuals.
- E. Promote the hobby to the general public and community.
- F. Concentrate the Club's general activity toward public service amateur radio communications.

ARTICLE III. Membership:

The membership shall be open to anyone, licensed or unlicensed, who is interested in the hobby of Amateur Radio. Two types of membership are available;
(1) ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP - which provides for full participation in all Club activities.
(2) ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP - which provides for limited participation for those who cannot attend regular business meetings. Associate members pay one-half the active membership dues, cannot vote in Club business and cannot hold any office in the Club.

ARTICLE IV. Officers:

The officers of this Club shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, Activities Manager, and President Emeritus.

The officers shall be elected by secret ballot at the first general membership meeting in April. They shall serve for one year and may be re-elected for one additional term but shall not be eligible for re-election to more than two consecutive terms. The immediate Past President shall become President Emeritus and a voting member of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE V. Trustees:

Three trustees in each odd-numbered year and two trustees in each even-numbered year shall be elected annually by secret ballot at the first general membership meeting in April to serve on the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VI. Executive Board:

The five trustees and the six officers shall serve as the Executive Board and there must be a majority present at any board meeting to conduct official business.

ARTICLE VII. Vacancies:

Vacancies occurring among the officers and trustees of the Club shall be filled by special election and secret ballot at the first regular business meeting at which the vacancy is made generally known. Such newly elected person(s) shall serve only the remainder of the existing term to which elected.

ARTICLE VIII. Meetings:

Section 1. The Club shall meet regularly in general membership meetings on the third Saturday of each month unless changed by special membership

Section IV - DUES

A. The annual dues shall be \$8.00, payable on or before the anniversary date of Club membership. The MIKE AND KEY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB by majority vote at any general membership meeting may levy upon the general membership such dues or assessments as shall be deemed necessary.

B. Any member who has been dropped from membership because of non-payment of dues shall not be reinstated until re-elected to the Club or has paid dues in full from the date at which they became delinquent.

C. No cancellation or refund of dues shall be made if a member resigns.

Section V - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

A. PRESIDENT - The President shall preside at all meetings at which he/she is present; shall exercise supervision over the affairs and activities of the Club; and shall serve as member ex-officio on all standing committees, except on the nominating committee.

B. VICE-PRESIDENT - The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President during his or her absence, to include ex-officio membership in all standing committees except the nominating committee and to be responsible for maintenance of the membership records.

C. SECRETARY - The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all Club meetings and shall keep accurate and official records of the Club business transacted. He/she shall conduct all Club correspondence excluding records or correspondence of the various officers or committees. The Secretary shall also be the custodian of all Club records unless a special person is appointed for this purpose.

D. TREASURER - The Treasurer shall receive all Club funds, keep them in a bank or repository selected or approved by the Club and pay out funds only on an order signed by the President and/or Secretary. Other disbursements may be made by motion and approval of the general Club membership at an official meeting.

E. ACTIVITIES COORDINATOR - The Activities Coordinator shall be responsible for all Club activities other than general business meetings.

F. PRESIDENT EMERITUS - The President Emeritus shall perform the duty of chairman of the Audit and Finance Committees.

Section VI - DUTIES OF TRUSTEES

Trustees shall perform the duties of Club auditors, and shall also perform the duties of a finance committee. All major monies spent pertaining to the function of the Club will be reviewed by the elected trustees.

Section VII - DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE BOARD

The duties of the Executive Board shall be to act for the membership to expedite actions of the official membership meetings. In this capacity the Executive Board acts on items of business and makes recommendations to the general membership. The Executive Board shall consider, promote, and transact business subject to instructions of the Club as expressed by a vote at a regular business meeting. The President of the Executive Board is elected by the board as a whole at the first board meeting after election of members to the board has been completed.

Section VIII - COMMITTEES

A. Committee chairmen shall be appointed by the President and Activities Coordinator as they deem necessary and ratified by the Club. Committee chairmen shall make reports to the Club on committee progress at general membership meetings. Committees can consist of, but not limited to:

1. Social functions - banquet, Xmas party, picnic
2. Contests - Field Day, Sweepstakes
3. Public Service - ARES, Bike-a-thon, Walk-a-thon
4. Fund Raising - Auction
5. Education and Training - Field trips, Tune-up seminars

B. Special committees may be appointed by the President or the Executive Board at any time as the need arises.

Section IX - ORDER OF BUSINESS

The recommended order of business at all general membership meetings shall be:

- A. Meeting called to order. Introduction of visitors.
- B. Identification of officers and roll-call of members.
- C. Acceptance of minutes.
- D. Reports of officers and committee chairs.
- E. Unfinished business.
- F. New business.
- G. Adjournment
- H. Program or social hour

Section X - QUORUM

One-third (1/3) of the active membership shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section XI - AMENDMENTS

Any amendment to these By-Laws may be proposed at any regular meeting, to be adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the active members present at the following general business meeting; provided, the proposed amendment receives the approval of the Executive Board and a written notice of said amendment is sent to the general membership.
