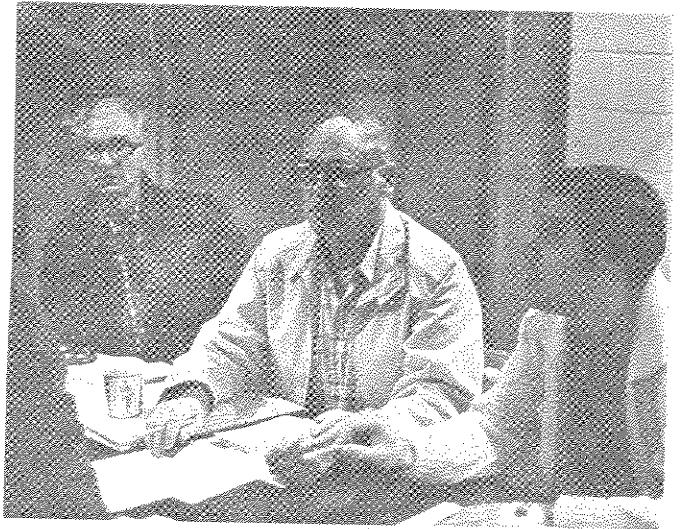

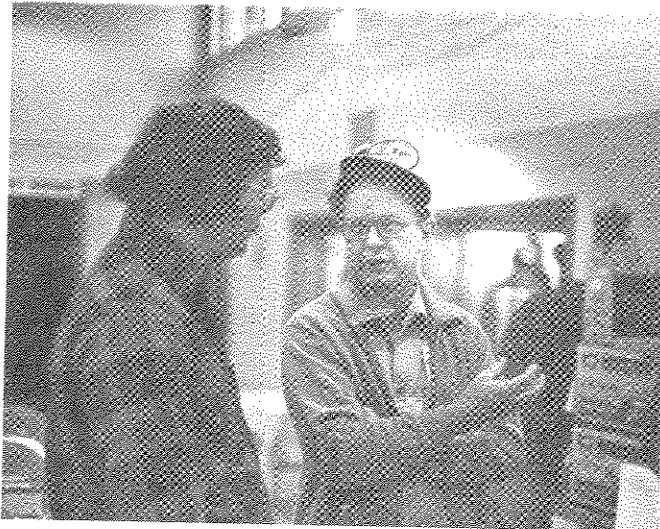

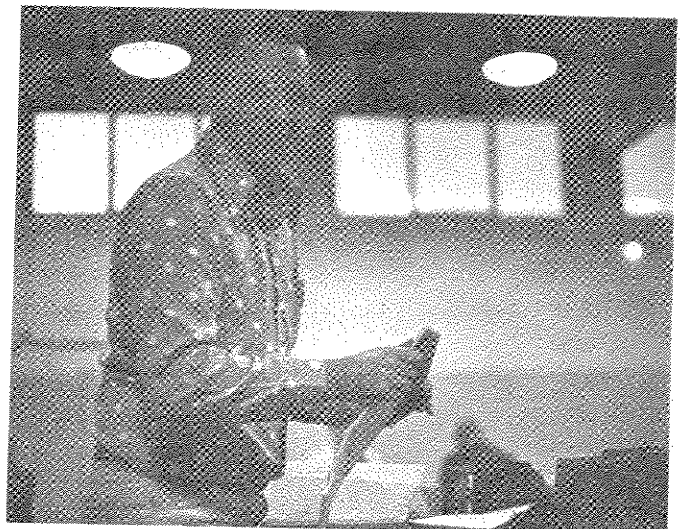

Here is an unusual recipe to try. At Christmas there's fruitcake for the hubby and cookies for the kids. But what about Rover, or ROSEBUD (K7YR) or MISSY (WA7KBK), or WILLIE (N7AMX).

HOMEMADE DOG BISCUITS

- 3½ cups all-purpose flour
- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 cup rye flour
- 1 cup cornmeal
- 2 cups cracked wheat
- 1 cup nonfat dry milk
- 4 teaspoons salt
- 1 package dry yeast
- 2 cups chicken, or beef stock
- 1 egg, and 1 tablespoon milk (to brush on top of biscuits)

Combine all dry ingredients except yeast. In separate bowl dissolve the yeast in $\frac{1}{4}$ cup water. Add the meat stock to yeast mixture, then add all liquids to dry ingredients. Knead 3 minutes. Dough will be stiff - more liquid, or an egg can be added. Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Roll dough out on floured board to $\frac{1}{4}$ " thickness. Cut with cookie cutter. Place on ungreased cookie sheet, brush with egg and milk mix. Bake 45 minutes at 300 degrees. Turn oven off and leave "bones" in oven overnight to harden.

PISTACHIO FRUIT SALAD

- 2 - 3 and 3/4 oz packages of Instant Pistachio Pudding Mix
- 1 large (16 oz) and 1 medium (9oz) Cool Whip
- 3 cans Salad Fruit
- 1 cup coconut
- 1 cup nuts

Mix pudding mix (dry) with the Cool Whip while it is still frozen. It may be mixed with a mixer. Drain the fruit and fold it into the Cool Whip and all coconut and nuts. Garnish with marchino cherries and nuts.
