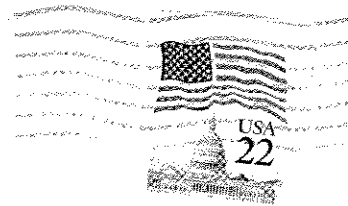
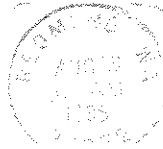

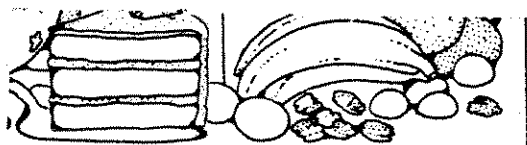

MICROWAVE PEANUT BRITTLE

Mix in 1½ quart casserole.

1 Cup sugar

½ Cup white corn syrup

HIGH TECH. ALARM SYSTEM

HI FELLOW CLUB MEMBERS,

MANY OF YOU PROBABLY HAVE SEEN ME AROUND AT CLUB MEETINGS WITH A LITTLE RADIO SHACK PAGER STICKING OUT OF MY SHIRT POCKET.

I WOULD LIKE TO SHARE A PRETTY NEAT WAY TO KEEP A WATCH ON YOUR HOUSE WHEN NO ONE IS HOME.

I FIRST BOUGHT A RADIO SHACK PAGER FOR ABOUT \$80. I AM NOT SURE IF OTHER BRANDS OF PAGERS WILL WORK OR NOT.

THE NEXT ITEM I BOUGHT WAS A DUOFONE HOME MONITOR (RADIO SHACK) OR A SENSAPHONE (WHICH IS IDENTICAL TO THE RADIO SHACK BRAND). THIS ITEM IS REALLY A SMALL COMPUTER THAT HOOKS TO THE PHONE. IT WILL AUTOMATICALLY DIAL ANY PHONE NUMBER YOU PROGRAM INTO IT. THE MONITOR WILL DIAL WHEN IT HEARS A LOUD NOISE, SUCH AS FROM A SMOKE ALARM, OR BURGLAR ALARM, THAT WILL SOUND OFF AT LEAST 10 SECONDS OR MORE. YOU CAN MONITOR THE HIGH TEMP. OR LOW TEMP. OR IF THE ELECTRICITY GOES OFF FOR MORE THAN 5 MINUTES.

THIS MONITOR WILL ALSO ANSWER THE PHONE AND GIVE YOU A STATUS CHECK PLUS IT WILL ALLOW YOU TO LISTEN FOR 15 SEC. IN YOUR HOME AND THEN IT WILL TELL YOU TO "HAVE A GOOD DAY" AND THEN HANG UP.

THE MONITOR WILL DO A LOT MORE BUT I JUST DON'T HAVE SPACE TO TELL YOU ABOUT IT.

SO TO SUM IT ALL UP THIS IS HOW IT WOULD WORK. SUPPOSE YOUR HOUSE FOR SOME REASON SHOULD CATCH ON FIRE, THE SMOKE ALARM WOULD SOUND OFF, WHICH WOULD MAKE YOUR HOME MONITOR DIAL YOUR PAGER NUMBER AND YOU WOULD BE PAGED ANYWHERE IN THE PUGET SOUND AREA. YOU WOULD THEN DIAL BACK YOUR OWN PHONE NUMBER AND THE HOME MONITOR WOULD TELL YOU WHAT IS WRONG. YOU THEN WOULD CALL THE FIRE DEPT. OR YOUR NEIGHBOR AND HAVE THEM CHECK IT OUT. HOPEFULLY YOUR NEIGHBOR WOULD SPOT THE SMOKE FIRST, BUT IF NOT, A HOME MONITOR MIGHT, THUS SAVE YOUR HOUSE.

NOW IF A BURGLAR BROKE INTO YOUR HOUSE THE ALARM WOULD GO OFF SILENTLY OR LOUDLY THE SAME THING WOULD HAPPEN. YOU WOULD CALL THE POLICE AND THEN TELL YOUR NEIGHBOR TO CHECK FOR ANY KIND OF VEHICLE IN FRONT OR BACK OF THE HOUSE. THEY WOULD TRY AND GET THE LICENSE NUMBER.

NOW I KNOW THAT THIS SYSTEM ISN'T CHEAP BUT IT COULD SAVE YOUR HOUSE. ALSO YOUR INSURANCE WOULD BE CHEAPER.

I ALMOST FORGOT TO TELL YOU THAT THE PAGER ALSO WORKS AS A PERSONAL PAGER. THE MONTHLY FEE FOR THE PAGER RUNS ABOUT \$8 A MONTH WITH NO LIMIT ON HOW MANY CALLS YOU CAN RECEIVE.
