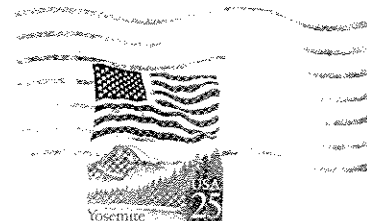

SUBJ: Need for Volunteers

Many months ago with the cooperation of the Puget Amateur Radio Society, an effort was started to organize a group of volunteer amateur radio operators in support of the emergency and disaster communications needs of public safety agencies dispatched by Bellevue's Eastside Emergency Communications Center. While the organization of this group on the part of the City has been slow to develop, the importance of finalizing an operational support plan and organizing a solid core of amateurs who could respond in time of need now has taken on a renewed emphasis in our "emergency planning" efforts.

This group is not intended in anyway to conflict with the mission of R.A.C.E.S. or any other group which could be activated in time of emergency or disaster. It is intended to actively support the disaster and emergency communications needs of the agencies dispatched by the Eastside Communications Center and to work in close cooperation with King County's amateur radio emergency operations.

Who Should Volunteer? If you are willing to participate and you live in the fire districts serving Shoreline (F.D. #4), Lake Forest Park and Kenmore (F.D. #16), Bothell, Woodinville (F.D. #36), Kirkland, Redmond, Bellevue, or adjacent unincorporated areas (F.D. #42, F.D. #25) or, in any area from which you believe that you would be able to respond in a reasonable time frame to support eastside agencies.

Registration form will then be reviewed, your name added to the volunteer roster of the City, and the Support group mailing list.

We hope to soon have a bimonthly newsletter which will be distributed to all registered volunteers. The newsletter will be used to keep the members informed of our plans, training requirements and opportunities, and other information of interest.


Dear Ray,


FIELD DAY
