**REPEATER JAMMER IS
IDENTIFIED**

The Interference Identification Team sponsored by the Boeing Bears Amateur Radio Club has turned over to the FCC documentation (about 3 inches thick) on this Non-Ham individual. The FCC now has the ball and has instructed all individuals concerned to stop any further action as it (the FCC) will take over.

Since the appearance of this individual on 20 July 1991 the Boeing Bears Interference Identification Team has expended between 4,000 and 5,000 man-hours on this identification process. The Boeing club owns two electronic direction finders and had unlimited access to any of the equipment in the company's two way radio shop. In addition, several of the team's members also have DFing equipment.

This has been truly a team effort, not only by the interference team, but by the various repeater owners and operators. Special thanks goes to Phil Ferrell, K7PF, who was able to identify the transmitters used for this activity using the computer operated identification process he has developed.

Once the offending transmitter is "in the computer" (every transmitter has a different signature) it is compared with transmitters identified with a call sign or other means. When a match is made, the offending transmitter can then be identified to the individual using it for normal communications.

Special comments are in order for the repeater users on the 146.82 Mike and Key repeater. We have been commended for doing the best job on any of the repeaters, in ignoring the activity of this individual, and for not "taking him on". It was noted that this approach was difficult and at times almost impossible, however, the result was, that we, on the '82 repeater were not bothered near as much as some of the other repeaters in the area. In fact, our repeater was turned off only twice as a result of the activity. My thanks to you all for your restraint.

The FCC will be bringing a civil lawsuit against this individual, and it is my understanding that a criminal lawsuit may follow if presented by affected parties.

Again, thanks for your patience and understanding during this unpleasant time. As further information is known, I will get the word out. Many thanks go to the Boeing Bear's Interference Team for

the thousands of hours spent documenting this intrusion.

DE J.A.R.L. NEWSLETTER

The number of Japanese Amateur Radio stations in Japan came to 1,101,431 as of March, 1991!

During June, 1991, the Japan Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications (Japanese FCC) indicted or officially cautioned 84 personal stations, 78 CB stations, 2 cordless telephones, 12 other stations, and 26 illegal amateur stations. (only 26 out of over a million? and we yell about our own FCC!).

The '91 JARL-Japan Amateur Radio Festival recorded a total of 60,000 visitors for 1991. Far more than ever before and twice as many as attended the Dayton Hamvention this year. During that time, the special commemorative station, 8J1HAM, made QSO's with over 9,700 stations during the 3 days of the Hamfair. W7JIE

PIRATE RADIO BROADCAST STATION CLOSED DOWN DE FCC NEWS, 10-31-91

The FCC's Denver Office, in coordination with the Commission's nationwide monitoring network, closed down an unlicensed "pirate" broadcast station in Limon, Colorado, on October 6, 1991. Don Bishop, editor of a well-known radio trade magazine and an amateur radio station operator, was illegally operating on frequencies 15.050 MHz and 7.420 MHz. These frequencies are reserved for aeronautical mobile services and for fixed services, respectively.

Bishop's mobile illegal broadcasts had been monitored for several hours before he was stopped at approximately 8:30 p.m. The broadcasts consisted of satirical tapes transmitted by 1,000 watt radio transmitter. Bishop had traveled from Kansas to Colorado and was stopped as he traveled west on Highway 86 south of Limon.

Unlicensed operation of a radio transmitter is a violation of Section 301 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. Sanctions may include administrative fines of up to \$10,000 and/or criminal penalties of up to \$100,000 and/or imprisonment for up to one year. The misuse of radio frequencies is a serious matter because of the potential for interfering with safety-of-life radio services such as aviation, marine and law enforcement.

FLEA MARKET JOB DESCRIPTIONS

SETUP: Helps with facility setup. Sets up tables, chairs electrical drops, signs, etc.. Maintains isle widths, watches for electrical cord violations, keep stuff out of isles and etc. according to fire code regulations. Required from 12 to 9 PM Friday and 5 to 11 AM Saturday.

REGISTRATION: Helps with registration of sellers. Hands out sellers badges and packets. Checks on table setup and locations. Handles seller disputes. Required from 3 to 9 PM Fri. and 5 to 10 AM Saturday.

PALLET CREW: Handles pallet jacks, loaded pallet distribution, empty pallet pickup, elevator loading and unloading. Does not load or unload equipment on pallets. Required from 3 to 9 PM Friday and 5 to 10 AM and 3 to 6 PM Saturday.

SECURITY: Monitors doors for proper badges and tickets required for entrance into flea market area. Monitors ticket selling area to make sure no one grabs ticket monies. Gives information as needed. Required from 12 to 9 PM Friday and 5 AM to 6 PM Saturday.

PARKING CONTROL: Regulates amount of cars on fair grounds during setup and tear down. Monitors cars in loading / unloading area. Required from 3 to 9 PM Friday and 5 AM to 6 PM Saturday.

TICKET SELLERS: Sells flea market tickets from fair ground's ticket booths at fair entrance area. Stamps general admission hands as they enter turnstile area. Required from 7 AM to 3 PM Saturday.

COUNTRY STORE: Responsible for selling consignment items at country store area and collecting monies from sales. Required from 3 to 9 PM Friday and 5 AM to 4 PM Saturday.

TALK-IN STATION: Responsible for directing persons into fair ground area on 146.82 repeater. Radios and maps provided. Required from 3 to 9 PM on Friday and 5 AM to 2 PM Saturday.

ADMINISTRATION: Located in WSP building. Responsible for checking in workers, assignment of help for no shows, monitoring working radio channels, and general overall control of flea market. Required from 3 to 9 PM Friday and 5 AM to 3 PM Saturday.

VE TESTING: Handles VE testing sessions. Under control of Mike WA7UVJ and Jim K7ND.





ANNOUNCING: Handles announcing at PA setup during flea market. Required from 8 AM to 4 PM Saturday.

CLEAN UP: All available hands help load out remaining sellers, put away tables, chairs, partitions and general overall clean up of entire site. Required 3 to 6 PM Saturday.

Sign up sheets will be passed around at the next meetings.
