This month I thought I might review the "Links" web page at the Mike and Key web site at http://www.mikeandkey.com/links.htm. The web page is just a list of links to other web pages at other web sites. I recently completed checking all the links on this page and updating all that had changed web addresses and removing those that no longer exist.

The page has an index at the top to aid in finding a link to a particular type of site. The major categories are business, clubs, and operating links. The business index has the sub categories: sales, manufacturers, repair, software/computers, hamfests, and publications. The clubs are divided into the categories: northwest clubs, national clubs, and international clubs

One of the links under Businesses/Repair is to "W7FG Vintage Manuals". The W7FG lists over 5000 vintage radio manuals that they have available. W7FG also handles antennas, ladder line, and radio related books. If you have some radio equipment without the manual just visit this site and see if you can catch them without a copy of your needed manual in stock. A new listing under the northwest clubs category is "Puget Sound Radio Direction Finding" (a.k.a. "Foxhunting"). Charles (NZ0I) in Everett hosts this site. The focus of this site is what the title suggests. The site lists direction-finding events in the King, Kitsap, and Snohomish counties and a calendar of events. He has provided some inexpensive antenna and electronics projects to enhance your direction finding capabilities. There are

also links to additional sites of interest to the field of "foxhunting".

One of the links under "operating links/world wide" is to the joint USAF/NOAA report of current solar and geophysical activity and forecast. Visit our web site and see if there is something of special interest for you. Let me know if there are any other links that you would like to see added. The web is site is part of the Mike and Key image and I want to make it look the best.

# Overcoming life's challenges

David Lee doesn't let anything slow him down, even cerebral palsy

FAIRWOOD — David Lee will push himself out of his wheel-chair and crawl up a flight of stairs to catch a fleeing child and prove he can't be stopped.

Lee supervises kids at Meridian Junior High School as part of a day camp for the Auburn YMCA.

Seeing his wheelchair, some kids playfully tease him.

"Some kids have told me 'you can't get me! and run away," said Lee. "I'll pop out of my chair and crawl up the stairs. It may take me longer, but I won't let the fact I'm in a chair stop me."


Compared to other challenges he's faced in his life, chasing a giggling child is nothing for the 38-year-old Lee (who is not related to the Journal reporter). He even fights the diagnosis of his condition as cerebral palsy, believing that something else could be hampering him.

Besides working at the YMCA and a special camp for kids with disabilities, Lee also volunteers relentlessly. He's a licensed ham radio operator who works with Fire District 40, and a member of the King County Sheriff's Citizens Academy. He has taken Federal Emergency Management Agency courses on earthquake preparation. He also does ham radio work at area parades and race events, talking with other: radio operators and informing organizers of float or racer locations. And he is the statistician for the Kentridge High School boys basketball team.

Lee also works to help others with disabilities. He is the vice chairman of the Kent School District's student services advisory committee and a member of the district's disability compliance committee. He served on the design committee for the new Kentlake High School.

"David brings the viewpoint of a person in a wheelchair who has fought for his place in the system," said Kent School Board member Linda Petersen, who has known Lee for 11 years. "David has incredible perseverance. And he just doesn't quit."

It's a mindset that Lee learned early on in the Boy Scouts. He has

been a member of Troupe 714 for 26 years running. Lee was made an Eagle Scout in 1978, and two years ago founded Troupe 119 for Boy Scouts with disabilities so they can receive more support.

Elementary School and spent second and third grade at the Washington State Cerebral Palsy Center. He tried out regular classes at Meeker Junior High, and was in all regular classes by the time he was a junior at Kentilla

Lee went on to Highline Community College, and in 1992, graduated from Seattle University, with degrees in rehabilitation and psychology.

Lee hopes others won't have to face similar hardships growing up.

up.
"I want better for kids with disabilities now," he said. And by doing everything he's involved in now, "I want to show I'm regular, to myself and to the kids."

Lee does run into scheduling conflicts, as does his mother Gail Lee, who drives him to every job and activity. In fact, Lee's mother often stays with him as he works.

"We have no set schedule,"
Gail Lee said. She was reluctant
to talk about her son during an
interview, saying "I guess," when
asked if she is proud of him.

But David Lee said it's hard to stop her from talking about him to her friends.

"I say to myself, 'David, you can't live on your past accomplishments.' You must go further,'" he said. "Past accomplishments are nice, but there's more to do out there."
