Picnic – Dave KB7PSN: Picnic will be after the August meeting. Will be putting out sign up sheets.

Old Business-

MOU- Kirk Bellar N7UK came to the meeting to clarify any questions that we have regarding the proposed MOU with King County ARES. He noted that King County ARES currently uses our repeater on 146.82 for weekly drills on Sunday evenings from 8:00 PM until about 8:30 PM. In addition they use it for EOC-EOC drills which happen on the 5th Saturday every month that there is a 5th Saturday. Our repeater is not the sole resource used for these communications which mostly consist of traffic counts, and member participation levels. The individual teams have their own frequencies that are used for the actual traffic handling. Any messages handled on the repeater will be under NTS protocols which prioritize traffic as Emergency, Priority, or Routine, and any non ARES traffic of a higher priority would take precedence. Kirk explained that while ARES and RACES are different organizations, they are the same people at the leadership level. In the event that ARRL chooses to object to the use of the ARES name in the MOU, we could simply make the agreement with RACES.

In the event of a “real disaster” each of the approximately 25 teams in King County will be using their own local frequencies. Another visitor asked if King County ARES intended to run a formal net for the duration of any disaster. The question centered around just who would be the Net Control operator. Hal asked just who would use the repeater in light of the fact that the “Chaplain Rick” document lists King County ARES, Satern, and NTS as users of our repeater. The answer was that All would have access due to interoperation and cooperation among the three groups. Frank asked the question of why ARES doesn’t put up their own repeater. It was suggested that it could be on 222 Mhz, but 2 meters is the most common band for people involved in ARES. Carolyn asked why, since the agreement to use the repeater was supposedly a temporary arrangement until another repeater could be secured, nothing has been done to move to another frequency. This stipulation predates Kirk’s occupancy of the DEC position and he knew nothing of it. The problem seems to be the exclusive use that was asked for.

Daniel Stevens had a handout regarding SHB 2335 and some details of the MOU between ARRL and FEMA. Therefore, we already have an agreement with an agency that provides emergency services and should be exempt from the Leasehold Excise Tax. Therefore it would be improper for us to make an agreement with any other agency.

We all have the handouts and will study the matter and continue discussion next week.

Move to table by Terry, seconded by Gil. Motion passed.

New Business-

Frank requested that some recognition should be made for Mitch Gill K7TUT’s return to the US. All agreed.

Terry brought up the need for the President to form an Audit committee. This is supposed to be formed at the first of April. There needs to be an audit of the club’s equipment.

We will have to dispose of a trailer in a month or so. This is the old equipment trailer. Frank suggested that we list it in the Relay as being available for \$500 and see what results we get. If none, we could then offer it for sale to the public.

Paul suggested that one of our committees look into the issue of the MOU. There doesn’t seem to be one that would have that responsibility active at this time.

Good of the Order-

There being no further business, Frank moved for adjournment. Motion Passed and Chairman Steve closed the meeting at 8:31 pm.

BIO... Jim Etwiler – Webmaster

This time of year the Relay tries to publish profiles of newly elected officers and others that are active in the Mike and Key ARC, so the new members can get to know who is guiding the club.

Jim Etwiler is married to Rusty. Jim's daughter and family lives north of Seattle and Rusty's son and family lives in Puyallup.

Jim grew up and graduated from high school in Montana, attended the University of Washington, earning a BSAA (1967) and MSAA (1968)

Jim is employed by The Boeing Company as a structural engineer and has been with them since June 1968. He has worked both on military airplanes and missiles and commercial airplane products. In structures, he works in a discipline called flutter, the prevention of destructive oscillations caused by a combination of unsteady aerodynamics, structural deflections, and damping forces. In 1998 Jim was recognized as an Associate Technical Fellow at Boeing (The TF program includes about 1.4% of the all the employees at Boeing). Jim was recently transferred to Boeing Commercial Airplanes to work on the new 787-8 airplane certification and new 787-3 and -9 derivatives.

Jim has been a member of Mike and Key ARC since March 1999, joining after helping with the Flea Market that spring. He was elected Treasurer March 2000 and served until his job sent him out of state in the fall of 2002. Jim has been the webmaster for the club web site since the fall of 1999. (At last count the web site had 472 files and growing.) He also participates in the Public Service committee, as a member of the Facilities committee is the liaison with the Salvation Army about our use of the building, attends most of the Flea Market committee meetings and helps on the Education committee.

In addition to the above activities, Jim participates with the BEARS (Boeing Employees Amateur Radio Society) and WWARA (Western Washington Amateur Relay Association).

Jim is a member of KCSARA (King County Search and Rescue Association) and works with ESAR (Explorer Search and Rescue) as an in-town contact during missions or as a qualified van driver.

He is the webmaster for 5 web sites. Two are amateur radio related (mikeandkey.org and wwara.org). Two others are earth sciences related for mineralogy clubs he belongs to and one is for a rocks and minerals museum.

Jim is currently a member of two national technical committees in conjunction with his work assignments, American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics – Structural Dynamics Technical Committee and American Flutter and Dynamics Committee. He also is an active member of Society of Mineral Museum Professionals.
