## 501 (c)3 Committee Report By Jim Kiniry, Jr., KE7JIM, Treasurer

Work is progressing with our IRS Form 1023 application for Section 501 (c)3 tax exempt status.

We need input from Mike & Key Members to fill Form 1023 – Part IV "Narrative Description of Activities", the heart of our application.

#### Form 1023 - Part IV states:

Using an attachment, describe your *past, present,* and *planned* activities in a narrative. If you believe that you have already provided some of this information in response to other parts of this application, you may summarize that information here and refer to the specific parts of the application for supporting details. You may also attach representative copies of newsletters, brochures, or similar documents for supporting this narrative. Remember that if this application is approved, it will be open for public inspection. Therefore, your narrative description of activities should be thorough and accurate. Refer to the instructions for information that must be included in your description.

Dave Yarbrough's ARRL application will be a part of this as well as Daniel Stevens Education Class statistics.

Per discussion at December's Board Meeting and comments from Michael – KG7MX: We need to show several examples that "The Mike and Key Amateur Radio Club is a charitable, educational and scientific organization which is in the process of assembling its application for recognition by the Internal Revenue Service as tax exempt under Section 501 (c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code."

- Michael Hansen KG7MX: He suggested that the first page of the new website be modified to reflect our intent to obtain recognition of tax-exempt status. At present, he believes that the webpage does not convey clearly that the Club is claiming that status. Specifically, he suggested that the the following language (more or less) be added to the heading beginning "The Club": "The Mike and Key Amateur Radio Club is a charitable, educational, and scientific organization which is in the process of assembling its application for recognition by the Internal Revenue Service as tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code."

- Michael Hansen KG7MX: Legal issues were discussed.

- Jim Kiniry KE7JIM: Copies of the proposed 2018 Budget were passed out to all Board members; updated items for the upcoming year, as well as Board-suggested changes, were discussed. A motion was made for the Board approval - and to send to the membership for their approval - of the proposed 2018 Budget (as amended); the motion passed.

- Jim Kiniry KE7JIM: There is still much work to be done for the Club's Form 1023 501(c)(3) application. Recent work on (and the current state of) the application was discussed.

- Concerns about the proposed Salvation Army rental agreement were aired, as it pertains to scheduling and advance notice of potential conflicts.
